What's Happening at Natoaganeg School



Attendance Policy

School attendance is taken at 8:30 a.m. Your child is late at 8:31 a.m. Breakfast is served from 8:05 -8:30 am. Walkers should arrive as close to 8:15 am as possible (especially if they are eating breakfast).

This will be year 3 of implementing the policy regarding attendance and also promoting good attendance through the initiative.

All students arriving after 8:31 am are considered tardy and **parents must sign them in**

at the office before going to class. The best time to drop off students is before 8:31 am. All students being dropped off must arrive through the main doors of the building. **Parents must park in the school parking lot and walk your child into school and sign the late form.**

Education Only Helps those in Attendance Especially if you are on time and in perfect attendance- Don't miss out----YOU ARE WORTH IT.

The goal is to promote attendance at school, encourage punctuality, and discourage tardiness. For each day that a class has perfect attendance at the start of the school day (when the first class begins), the classroom teacher will put up a letter outside of their room.

Attendance is important to the overall academic and social success of your child. Attendance will be taken within the first 10 minutes of each school day. Parents and/ or guardians are required to contact the school each and every day your child is absent. If parents do not call before 10 a.m., school staff will call you at home or at work to find out the reason for the absence. Students with perfect attendance will go into a monthly draw to win a Tim's card to take their parents for a coffee to thank them for bring them to school on time and everyday.

For instance, on the first day that the class has perfect attendance, the teacher will put up the letter **N**. This continues until a class has spelled out **NEKAW NAQSI P +SIN**. The first class (or multiple classes) that spells out the phrase will receive a class pizza party, at the end of the week in which the class won.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct has shown improved student behaviour last school year and we are aspiring for our students to continue demonstrating their ability to show good character. This document will bring current school behaviours, policies and practices together with Policy 703 NB Student Code of Conduct. There is an increased emphasis on intervention, training, and consequences that are planned to help students learn how to behave rather than just punishment. There might be times when behaviour warrants detention or suspension. The school staff has practice this philosophy and we have seen great success in the past school years. The emphasis is to create a culture of acceptable behaviour within the school. Students will be trained how to behave in a variety of situations including playground, lunch, hallways classroom and when a supply teacher is present. We believe that all students are capable of behaving well, so it is our job to equip them with the necessary skills to do so.

Blushing Applesauce

Ingredients 55 m inutes 10 servings 179 cals

5 pounds Macintosh apples, quartered and cored 3/4 cup sugar 3/4 cup water 1/4 cup lemon juice 1 teaspoon cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg Add all ingredients to list Directio Prep. Cook 25 m 30 m

Place apples in a large pot with the sugar. water, and lemon juice. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to medium-low and simmer uncovered, stirring occasionally, until the apples are very soft and lose their shape, about 25 minute

Remove the apples from the heat and allow to cool slightly. Puree apples in a food processor or food mill. If using the food processor, strain the apples through a sieve to remove the pieces of apple skin.

Stir in the cinnamon and nutmeg. Serve at noom temperature or refrigerate and serve cold.


